COUNTY HIGHWAY SYSTEM

The Richland County Highway System consists of 347 miles of County roads plus 360 bridges on both County and Township highways. The entire highway system and bridges has a replacement value of close of \$400,000,000. Our highway system is approximately equivalent to a road stretching from Richland County to Washington, D.C. or Chicago, Illinois. We try to keep on top of the repairs, maintenance, snow removal, etc. but if a motorist sees something unusual on a highway or bridge we would appreciate a call for us to check it out. You may call (419) 774-5594 between 7 AM and 3:30 PM weekdays (summer hours 6:30 AM and 5 PM, Monday thru Thursday) to report an item of concern. Remember, good roads contribute to safe highways.

SPEED LIMITS

Speed Limits on county highways are established by Ohio law and they are usually 55 mph. A speed limit sign for 55 mph does not need to be posted in order to be enforceable. If a speed limit needs to be reduced for safety reasons, a Speed Zone Study must be prepared to justify the speed limit change. The Richland County Commissioners and the Ohio Department of Transportation must review and approve any change in the speed limit on county highways. The Richland County Regional Planning Commission generally prepares the Speed Zone Study for the Richland County Engineer.

ROADS


In 2018, the County completed a newly developed Pavement Condition Rating (PCR) for all 347 miles of County Highway. This was a two year process in which every mile of roadway was rated on different factors. These factors included: surface type, cracking, rutting, base failure, potholes, pavement marking condition, etc.

The PCR rating will be used to monitor pavement conditions, determine future maintenance, and determine the type of maintenance/resurfacing work that will be needed. Every couple years, roadways will need to be reevaluated to determine current PCR values.

*The difference in mileage (347.7 inventory to 350.9 PCR) is due to those sections of roadway that have shared jurisdiction (½ of road is in County, other ½ is in municipality).

BRIDGES

Bridges on county and township roads are inspected at least once yearly under the direction of Chad Coward, P.E. of the County Engineer's Office. We are responsible for 360 bridges. Repair work and some bridge replacements, as needed, are performed by Kim Gosser, Bridge Foreman, and the Highway Department. Other bridge replacements are done by contractors.

Each bridge is rated as to its ability to carry trucks and automobiles safely across the structure. Signs are posted in advance of the bridge indicating the maximum vehicle weights for structures with reduced weight limits. Truck drivers and operators of heavy farm machinery should pay particular attention to the advance weight limit signs. It could prevent serious damage to the bridge or the vehicle, or both. Also, the Richland County Engineer issues oversize or overweight vehicle permits for those vehicles that are in excess of the legal size or weight requirements. When a permit is issued, operators will be advised of the route around these posted bridges. A relatively recent development is the use of Special Haul Vehicles on our highways. These vehicles, usually dump trucks with additional axles, can increase stresses in bridges by up to 30 percent more than other vehicles. Due to these new loading configurations several bridges have been posted with new weight restrictions in 2018.

RETENTION BASINS

The Richland County Engineer Office is responsible for 12 retention basins in land subdivisions located in Springfield, Troy, Madison and Mifflin Townships. We provide at least one inspection of these retention basins annually plus arrange for repairs, mowing, etc., as needed.

While our responsibilities for retention basins are not a major function of this office, it is still important for the safety and wellbeing of the citizens in the areas where these facilities are located.

STORM WATER DRAINAGE

Roadside ditches are a very important part of the pavement drainage system for our county highways. These road side ditches are maintained by the Richland County Highway Department. Drainage ditches that flow from or onto the county highways from private property are the responsibility of the property owner for maintenance, etc. The exception to this rule would be if the county has an easement of record to maintain a ditch on private property.
